

## Assignment Option #6 – Power Point Presentation:

### What is “sexting”?

Sexting is the act of sending, receiving, or forwarding sexually suggestive text messages and images, including nude or semi-nude photographs, via cellular telephone or over the internet.

### What are some of the consequences?

Teens need to be aware that “sexting” is against the law and that they can be arrested, charged and convicted for manufacturing, possessing, and/or distributing child pornography. For the victim, the damage can be as severe as other forms of bullying, sexual harassment and abuse. The consequences can also be permanent. Once an image has been posted online it is very difficult to get back. This means that the image may be circulating as teens start to pursue future career endeavours and/or volunteer opportunities. Many other consequences include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Criminal record
- Humiliation
- Loss of privacy
- Bad reputation
- Lost opportunities (employment, volunteer etc.)
- Destroyed relationships
- Bullying/Harassment
- School discipline
- Depression
- Regret
- Isolating behaviours
- Truancy
- Suicide/Self harm
